STEPHEN MINISTRY Stephen Ministries

Stephen Ministries was founded based on the example of Stephen in Acts 6:1-7. In this passage the 12 disciples recognize that they need to set others apart to do other things in the name of Christ while they go and preach his word. In this case they set apart Stephen and 6 others to care for those who could not care for themselves, namely the widows. Some members of our congregation have agreed to care for others by walking beside someone through life's difficult circumstances. These members have become Stephen Ministers and are highly trained to care for others.

They are doing as Paul tells us in Galatians 6:2, that we are to "bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ". I know that there are people in our church and our community who carry heavy burdens, some of which we may never know about. But all could use the relief of someone to walk alongside them. In the past year I have come to see that there is another side to what Paul is saying in Galatians, though Paul does not state it straight out. The other side is that for someone to help carry our burdens we have to allow them to take it from us. We have to be aware and honest that we need help. Somewhere along the way we have become a society of independent people who pick ourselves up by our boot straps and try and handle things alone. I would guess that most of us, myself included, would more easily reach out to help someone else than to accept help when we have something going on.

May through June of 2017 I found out that I could not "do it" on my own. From a cancer diagnosis to the death of my mother, life got more and more difficult. I kept hearing myself say I'm fine because I did not want to "bother anyone". Thankfully I had so many people that ignored my "I'm fine" and took so many of the burdens off my shoulders in acts big and small, that I was able to see God's love and care in very real ways. If I had not allowed them to help me I would have missed the blessings that God was sending to me and stolen the blessings that God was giving to those who helped me. I find that God often sends people to show us his love and care....we have to be willing to accept it.

Where are you struggling??? Where are your friends and family members struggling???? How can we as brothers and sisters of the faith help carry your and their burdens? Consider a Stephen Minister to walk with you or someone you know and receive some relief as your load is lightened. For more information please see me or Pastor Leslie.
