## Pastor's Perspective

### "The Business of Church"

Every once in a while, a pastor will hear someone make the statement, "The church isn't a business". Pastors, District Superintendents and Bishops will tell you that the business side of church leadership is biblical. Jesus taught a great deal about money and about how to handle the treasury of the temple, how to oversee helping the poor, how to delegate leadership responsibilities, worship responsibilities, and how to organize volunteers.

This day and time, we add to the mix the following business transactions every month: banking transactions, utility contracts, phone and internet services, insurance liabilities and policies, denominational-required Ministry Safe compliance which involves background checks and training to avoid legal implications and problems. Then there is staffing, workman's compensation, salaries that involve quarterly taxes, accountability to personnel/SPR teams with evaluations, district level paperwork and filings, conference paperwork and filings – and business is very necessary to make sure we are legitimate, fully functioning and in compliance with legal laws. Jesus even said, "Render unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's and unto God the things that are God's." (Matthew 22:21)

So what is the flip side of the business of the church? That is the spiritual side of the church. That is preaching, teaching, caring, Bible study, children and youth ministry, JOY Ministry, lay visitation, mission work locally and globally. The spiritual side is baptisms, weddings and funerals. It is Confirmation, Promotion Sunday, Children's Sabbath, Vacation Bible School. It can be seen in care for others like: Thanksgiving Baskets, Kids Against Hunger, Snack Buddies, Food Pantry, Senior Commodities, Worship Beyond the Walls, Brushstroke of Love, and Back to School Bash. It is lived out through Stephen Ministry, United Methodist Women and Women's Ministry. And it is visible through hospitality moments with parking lot

greeters, door greeters, secret service angels, ushers, liturgist, media techs, Praise Team, Handbells and Youth Praise Group.

Business is defined as a vocation, calling, field, profession, occupation, position, pursuit; marketing, merchandising, dealings, transactions, negotiations, proceedings - where goods or services are exchanged. The goods here is the Good News and the exchange is hearts transformed. Business is definitely part of the church and has been since the beginning. The way this church has been so successful over the last several pastorates is to balance both the spiritual and the business. As we continue to grow, we have to assess both sides and keep the balance. Sometimes that means looking at God's vision laid out for us and then asking ourselves what is best for the church as a whole.

For instance many thought Ministry Safe was too much business. But, if you turn on the news these days and see the devastation that has happened in the Catholic Church and on a local Baptist University, you are witnessing the legal liabilities and implications of not taking a more active business stance and creating safeguards for children, youth, women, vulnerable adults, staff, and the institution itself. We have had a number of new families comment on how glad they are that we have these systems in place.

"Churches can learn sound operating principles from the business world. And at the same time, keep business in its proper perspective. Judas betrayed Jesus because he put financial concerns ahead of spiritual. The church that ignores the reality of its business side will eventually find itself in trouble legally, financially, or both; the church that overemphasizes its business side will eventually cease to meet the spiritual needs. Between these two extremes is the healthy church whose sound operating principles serve and facilitate its spiritual ministry."

As the church universal stands on the corner of a wonderful opportunity to minister to the world in new and exciting ways to a generation that did not grow up in the church, those who did grow up in the church have much to offer. We will need to offer many doors for which people can enter and get involved, but we have the people here who are about the business of making disciples for Jesus Christ – corporately and spiritually.

## Pastoral Change

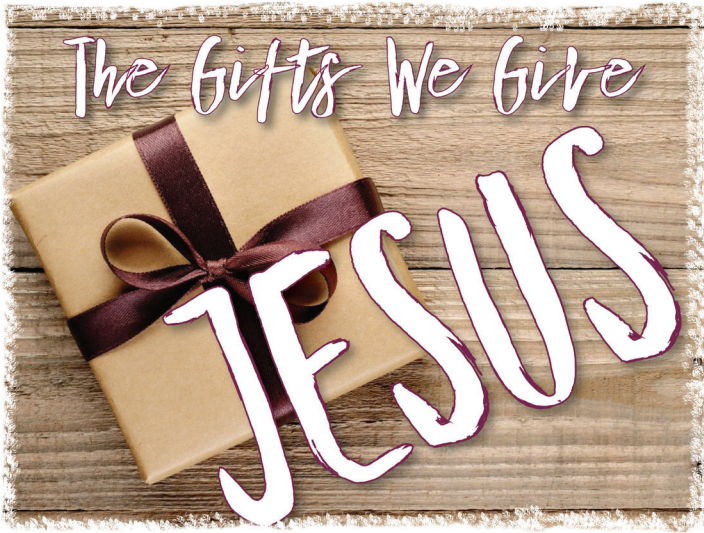

David, his wife Mandi, and their two children, Ellie (6) and Josiah (5 in July) will become the pastoral family on July 1, 2019. The SPR of Troy UMC will host a Pot Luck "Meet and Greet Dinner" with Leslie introducing David, for the people of Troy to get acquainted before he begins God's work here on July 1st.
