Last month in my article for the newsletter, I wrote about the upcoming General Conference of the United Methodist Church and the impending issues of human

Methodist Church and the impending issues of human sexuality that the conference would be dealing with. At that time, I knew there would be news regarding this that would begin coming out. What I didn't know is how soon the news would begin. It was about a week after I wrote my article that a formal proposal for the separation of the United Methodist Church was announced which quickly became national news. The announcement has been such that the news hasn't dissipated and it even appeared in the Temple Daily Telegram this past week.

I hadn't wished to belabor this talking point, but I feel it necessary to be clear about an aspect of the proposal which has been released. The first point is that the proposal is just that, a proposal. Everything leading up to the General Conference in May is not official until voted upon by the legislative body at General Conference. Between now and then, there will assuredly be more proposals regarding possible futures for the United Methodist church that will be released and considered at General Conference. The fact of the matter is, nothing is official yet and won't be until the end of May.

I also want to write a little on our denomination structure and what General Conference is. The United Methodist Church is structured by ever increasing levels of region administration. At the basic and most foundational level, there is the local church. Each local church is gathered into a smaller regional group called a District which is overseen by a District Superintendent. Troy UMC is in what is known as the South District of the Central Texas Conference. Our district includes all United Methodist Church in Bell, Coryell, and Williamson Counties. The District is overseen by a pastor appointed by our Bishop who is known as a District Superintendent. The level of organization above the District level is the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference is made up of a number of Districts over a larger geographic area. Our own conference is the Central Texas Conference and encompasses an area from Round Rock on the South to Red Oak on the North East over through the Mid Cities and Fort Worth to Olney on the North West to Ballinger on the West. Each Conference is overseen by a Bishop and a staff in the conference office that manages the day to day administration of this group of churches.

Each year all the churches within the Conference meet together for three days in what is known as Annual Conference to decide on matters pertaining to the administration of the Conference and the ministry that takes place within our churches. Every church gets to send lay delegates to Annual Conference to represent their own interest based upon the size of the church. Troy UMC gets two delegates and last year Betty and Lindsey Hester were our delegates to Annual Conference. Beyond the conference level is the General Conference level. The General Conference meets every four years (unless a special session is called as it was last year) and decides on matters of worldwide church law and practice. Individual churches do not get to send delegates to General Conference. Rather, each Annual Conference is allotted a number of delegates (both clergy and lay) that they may send to General Conference to represent their interests to this world wide body. Our Conference voted on our delegates this past year at Annual Conference. Clergy vote for clergy and laity vote for laity. Betty and Lindsey voted delegates to go to General Conference that they believed would best represent the interests of Troy UMC to General Conference. This large body of delegates from every Annual Conference in the world are the ones who will be voting and deciding upon the various plans submitted regarding the future of the United Methodist Church. The decisions that the body of the General Conference make become church law and are officially incorporated into the Book of Discipline which governs the administration of the whole United Methodist Church over the ensuing four years until General Conference meets again and revises this church law.

Please bear in mind that until after General Conference is over we can only speculate as to what the future holds for our denomination. Until that time and past it, I pray that even in our differences that we can practice and show love toward one another, and most importantly – no matter what may be happening within the larger denomination, never forget that we are called by Christ to His service within the world around us. May we follow Him in all that we do as a church and trust our future to His hands, wherever He may be guiding us.

Children's LYFE Group February Theme: The Rainbow Promise






