From Pastor David

As I sit down to write this newsletter article, I have ashes on my mind. I have just gotten home from offering Ashes to Go in our community, and will celebrate Ash Wednesday later on in the day. Yesterday, I took the palm branches from last year's Palm Sunday worship and burned them in a bowl to make the ashes that are a part of our ritual this day. A few weeks ago, I went to check on folks after a grass fire and helped to hose down still smoldering patches of yard. I've had ashes on my mind. After all, they're a fitting symbol to begin Lent. After a fire sweeps through an area, they are what remains. They drift in the wind, cling to shoes and clothes, carry the scent of smoke, blanket an area in drab greys and black. When I was in college, I went dove hunting with a friend at his family's place in East Texas. They had a recent fire on part of their land and called the burned and charred area the "Moon Scape", evoking images of a place devoid of life and growth. This is the symbol that we begin the season of Lent with. The remains of what once was, lifeless, still carrying the faint scent of the consuming flames.

As we enter Lent and the season of penitence and soul searching that precedes Easter, it is simple to become overwhelmed with the sorrow of the season and not to keep our eyes fixed on hope. If the fasts we endeavor to take remain solely about what we give up and do not also focus on what we are adding to our lives we can get caught in this trap. Yes, we realistically appraise our brokenness and sin, and offer it to Christ. But we need to do so in hope.

As I've said, I have had ashes on my mind. There's something about a burned landscape that can sap us of hope. When the flames of life seem to char us to the core, it's easy to lose sight of hope. When I was young, there was a grass fire that swept through the area where I grew up.. A neighbor down the road was welding on a dry windy day in summer and before he knew it a fire was raging beyond his control. After the fire I was looking out at our burned land and said to my dad, "Now we don't have any grass." He stood beside me and said, "Just wait." It wasn't long after that rain fell and a soft green blanket overcame the ashes of what was there before. The fire had removed the old thatch allowing the new to come in and I don't think I had ever seen more beautiful grass.

This Lent, fix your hope on Jesus and the renewing rains of His grace when you face the ashes and charred places of life. Know that the ashes aren't there forever, but through faith represent all that we need to leave in the past to find a continually new life in Christ. May you leave the past in ashes this Lent, and return to God. That on Easter morning, you may know the life giving and resurrecting power of Christ anew.


