

Background: Organization and Structure

- Based on Representative Government
- Organized and Governed by the Book of Discipline
- Structured into Conferences that oversee the mission and ministries of the denomination
 - General Conference Meets Every Four Years with delegates from around the world to set the Mission and direct the Major decisions of the denomination
 - Jurisdictional Conference Regional Areas in the US that meet every four years to elect and appoint Bishops and decide Annual Conference Boundaries
 - Annual Conference A Smaller Regional area that individual churches are members of that are overseen by a Bishop who appoints pastors and directs the mission and ministries of those churches
 - District A smaller geographic area where churches and pastors are directly overseen by a District Superintendent



Background: Local Church Structure

- Pastor, Appointed by the Bishop
- O Church Council
- O Trustees
- O Finance
- Staff-Pastor Relations Committee
- Other Groups and Committees
 - UMW, Youth, Children's Ministry, Missions, Evangelism, etc...

○ 1968 – Uniting Conference

• No determination one way or the other about LGBTQ persons/pastors

• 1972 – First General Conference after Uniting Conference

- Our long held "persons of sacred worth / incompatible" language appears in the Book of Discipline for the first time
- Contested each General Conference, yet remains.
- Early '00s, pastors and more progressive churches begin to intentionally defy this section of the Book of Discipline

○ 2016 – A Watershed Year


- General Conference was very much at a deadlock and standstill.
- Shadows of 2012 little accomplished because of hyper-focus on LGBTQ inclusion debate
- Request from conference floor for the Bishops to lead the denomination on this issue
- Formation of a Global Taskforce to provide options to be discussed at a special called session of General conference in 2019
- Western Jurisdiction elected first openly homosexual bishop
- Wesley Covenant Association founded

 Global taskforce meets and develops three different plans to present to called session of General Conference

- The 2019 General Conference meets with high expectations
- The status-quo is not only upheld but strengthened by traditionalists
- Passed by an extremely thin margin
- O Most delegates, even on the "winning" side feel defeated and begin to believe that the denomination would be better served to part ways rather than be forced to stay together.

• 2019 – After Special General Conference Session

- Kenneth R. Feinberg felt God speak to him while he was at his synagogue telling him to help the Methodists find a better way
- Gathered with leaders from each side of the UMC and helped lead them to create a new way forward
- Protocol of Grace through Separation
- Universally accepted would be presented at the 2020 G.C.



2020 General Conference – Rescheduled for 2021
2021 General Conference – Rescheduled for 2022
2022 General Conference – Canceled

• 2024 General Conference to take place as planned

- When General Conference 2022 was cancelled, the leadership of the traditionalists decided to not wait any longer for separation
- Global Methodist Church established May 1, 2022
- Much has been happening since this announcement took place



What's Currently Happening

• The Global Methodist Church has published their Transitional Doctrines and Discipline and is beginning to accept churches

- Our Annual Conference developed a process for disaffiliation and will hold a special session of the Annual Conference in September to formally allow the first group of churches to disaffiliate
- Currently, 92 churches have petitioned to explore disaffiliation in our Conference
- Support for the "Protocol" has started to be recended

Why is all this Happening

• The UMC has long been a denomination with a "big tent" theology.

• Over the years, we've been fracturing along these theological divides.

 LGBTQ inclusion has been the "presenting issue" of this divide

Why is all this Happening

• Other Factors in Play

- O Christology
- O Biblical Interpretation
- Willingness to follow or not follow the Book of Discipline
- Autonomy of the Local Church
- Weight of Institutional Structure

About the Global Methodist Church

 Consistent in Orthodox (traditional) Theology with a heavy emphasis on scriptural authority

- Focus on Accountable Discipleship
- O Church Planting and Multiplication
- Focus on Mission of the Church

• Lean Bureaucracy – Apportionments not to exceed 6.5% of budget

• Troy UMC Currently pays 5.7% of budget in apportionments

• No Trust Clause

About the Global Methodist Church

- Redefine Role of Bishops with Term Limits
- O Systematic Accountability
- More Congregational Input on Clergy Selection
- More Clergy input on Congregation Selection
- Easier Path to Ordination
- Uphold traditional understanding of marriage between one man and one woman, prohibit practicing LGBTQ people from ministry.

Choices Available to Local Congregations

- Remain in the United Methodist Church
- Wait for General Conference 2024 before making a decision
- Seek Disaffiliation
 - 2553 Gracious Exit (Expires December 2023)
 - 2548.2 Depart to an affiliate Denomination (1504.3)
 - O 2549 Go Independent
- Seek Legal Separation through US Court System

Disaffiliation: 2553 – Gracious Exit

• Added to the 2016 Book of Discipline at the Called 2019 G.C.

- Allows churches to Disaffiliate from the UMC over issues of conscience related to issues of human sexuality
- Requires 2/3 Majority Vote from Church Conference
- Terms of disaffiliation established between congregation and Conference board of Trustees
 - 2 Years Apportionments and Payment of Unfunded Pension Liabilities
- Simple Majority Vote from Annual Conference
- Expires December 31, 2023

2548.2 - Depart to an affiliate Denomination

- Not applicable to churches seeking to leave for the GMC
- Denomination leaving to must be in the Pan-Methodist Commission or other Evangelical Denomination by exchange of property, allocation, or comity agreement
- UMC currently has no Comity Agreement with GMC
- Potentially less burdensome financially

2549 – Go Independent

O All Property and Bank Accounts Surrendered to Annual Conference

O Buy back property using outside funds

Troy UMC – Where We're At

OChurch Council Met April 20 and discussed where we fell on this issue

• At that time: the conference hadn't even established what disaffiliation costs would be, but had a deadline to apply for disaffiliation. The GMC hadn't been

• Too soon of deadline (June 1) with insufficient information to make an informed decision

Troy UMC – What's (Most Likely) Next

- There will be a vote regarding the future of our church, to disaffiliate (and if so, to what denomination) or to remain United Methodist
- Before then, we will present the options to the congregation so you can make an informed decision
- Only Members of the church will be eligible vote
- The question about the vote is, "When?"
- Before Gracious Exit provision expires 12/31/23 or After General Conference 2024
